



## 2018-19 MEN'S TEST MATCHES

### 1. Laws of Cricket and Playing Conditions

The Laws of Cricket (2017 Code) in addition to ICC Standard Test Match Playing Conditions (version current at time of match as published by the ICC) shall apply to all Test Matches and Tour Matches except as modified below.

### 2. The Ball

ICC Regulations shall apply as regards to the ball. The Kookaburra "Turf" brand red ball has been approved by CA.

### 3. Duration of Matches

Test Matches shall be of five days scheduled duration, and of two innings per side. No rest days or reserve days are scheduled.

### 5. Boundaries

ICC Standard Match Playing Condition shall apply, except that the rope should be a required minimum distance of 4.47 yards (4 meters) inside the perimeter fencing or advertising signs.

### 6. Other Tour Matches



Wherever possible, the above conditions shall apply to all matches. Australian players shall be bound by the terms of the CA Code of Conduct. Touring team players shall be bound by Law 42 and/or the terms of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Team Officials. Cricket Australia shall appoint a representative to meet with the umpires and captains prior to the commencement of the match to secure uniform interpretation of these playing conditions and to adjudicate, if necessary, should there be any dispute.
